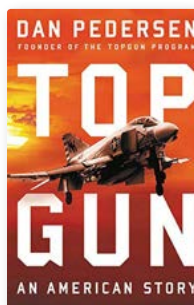

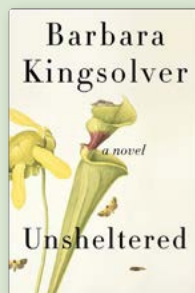

The HUB offers free classes to library

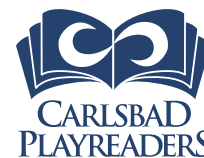
