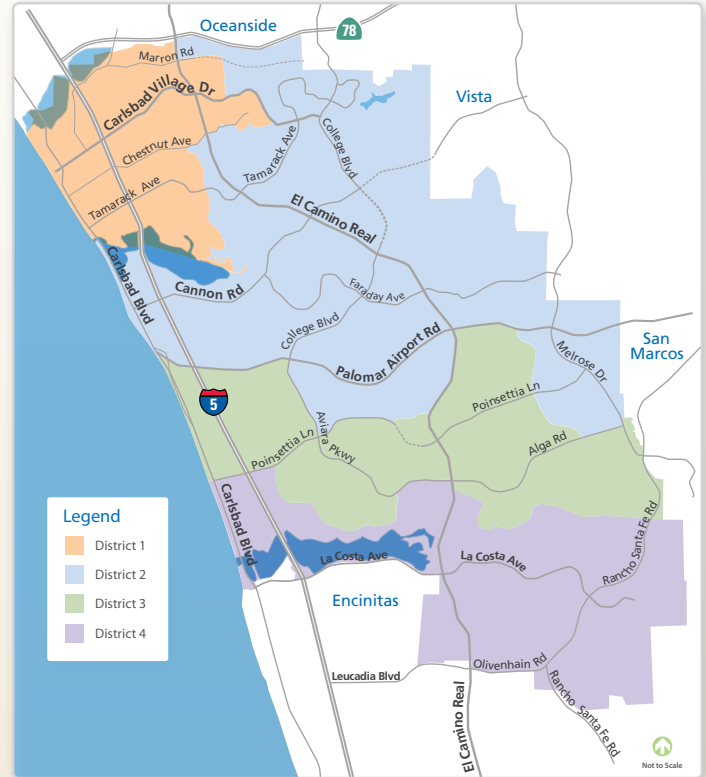


District elections coming in 2018

Starting in 2018, Carlsbad voters will elect their City Council members by district instead of “at large” or citywide. The change comes in response to a challenge issued in April to Carlsbad, along with most of its neighboring cities and dozens of others in California, claiming at large elections were a violation of the California Voting Rights Act. Professional demographers and members of the public worked together this summer to propose several district map options, and the City Council voted to adopt the final map in late July.

Fast Facts

- City Council members serve four year terms
- Council districts one and three will be up for election in 2018. Two and four in 2020
- The mayor will continue to be elected “at large.” The mayor’s term is up in 2018
- The city will have an opportunity adjust district boundaries every 10 years, after the census. Data from the next census will be available in 2021

The Carlsbad Municipal Water District has adopted new, less stringent water use rules, but officials remind the community that in our desert climate, water conservation is a part of our daily lives, drought or no drought.

Under the new rules, landscape irrigation is allowed on any day of the week (three days a week or less is recommended) and no longer limited to 10 minutes per sprinkler station.

Some mandatory water use restrictions, which are in effect regardless of the current “drought alert” level, include:

- **Irrigate** landscape before 10 a.m. and after 6 p.m. only.
- **Stop water waste** from inefficient landscape irrigation, such as runoff, overspray and misdirected sprinklers.
- **Use a bucket** or a hose with a shutoff nozzle when watering landscaped areas with no irrigation system.
- **Don't wash down** hard surfaces, such as driveways, patios, sidewalks and parking lots with a hose, unless necessary for safety or sanitation.

Is Your Garage an Invitation to a Thief?

Follow a few easy tips to ensure your garage is secure and don't give a thief the opportunity.

- Always close and lock all the doors to your garage. Even the pedestrian doors. Before you go to bed at night, double check.
- If you see that a neighbor's garage door is open, be a good neighbor and let them know.
- Store more valuable items like bicycles, tools and sporting equipment toward the back of the garage. Keep the door closed so it is out of site.
- If your garage is detached or shared, lock up valuables using a double locking system. If you cannot secure it, don't leave it behind.
- If your garage or if the storage unit in your garage is secured with a pad lock, choose a tamper resistant lock and a padlock cover.
- Check your storage unit door hinges. If the hinges are on the outside, use tamper resistant hinge pins.
- Never store weapons in a garage or vehicle. Store weapons properly in a specially designed safe.
