



Temporary Road Closure

Starting Nov. 9



Drainage Pipeline Installation

The City of Carlsbad must install a section of drainage pipe under Monroe Street. This project is time-sensitive and will require a temporary street closure.

- Road closure to through traffic will only be in effect between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m., Monday through Friday. No work will be performed on weekends or holidays.
- Project requires digging a trench in the middle of the street to access underground pipes
- Traffic will be detoured around the site
- Construction expected to last approximately 6 weeks

We apologize for the inconvenience and will complete this project as quickly as possible.

You May Be Asking ...

Why does this work need to be done now?

Since this is a drainage project, the city wants to complete this project before the winter rainy season.

Could it have been done when school was not in session?

The city tries to schedule construction projects at times that will cause the least amount of inconvenience to residents. In this case, the project could not wait until next summer, although we are trying to coordinate the schedule so that at least part of the construction period will be over the Thanksgiving break.

How do you choose the detour routes?

Our goal is to minimize traffic as much as possible around the construction zone and choose detour routes that can safely accommodate the extra drivers.

Why does the entire street need to be closed instead of just one lane?

Temporarily closing the road will allow crews to complete the work more quickly. Unfortunately, the drainage pipe is about 5 feet underground in the middle of the street. Whenever possible, we use a tunneling method to access pipes, which tends to be less disruptive. That wasn't an option for this project.

Will this project affect my water or power service?

Water and power services should not be affected by this project. The pipeline being replaced is for drainage in the neighborhood.

Could the construction hours be extended to complete the project sooner?

Yes, but not by much. Impacts to neighbors from dust, noise and other construction nuisances, inconveniences to those driving in the area and cost are all considerations when choosing a construction schedule.


Can I still walk or bike on Monroe between Basswood and Carlsbad Village Drive?

Bike and pedestrian access will be available; however please be safe and avoid entering the work area during active construction.

Why is this project needed?

A well maintained drainage system is critical to protecting public safety and property from flooding and water damage. New pipe materials resist corrosion and should last much longer than the old corrugated metal pipes.
