New trash service (cont.)

Single family residences will receive free wheeled carts for trash, recycling and green waste from Waste Management, the city's trash contractor, and can choose from three sizes for each type of service: 35, 64 or 96 gallon. The new service also

includes "single stream recycling," which means you won't have to sort recyclables into separate crates. Instead, all recyclables, such as paper, metal, glass and plastic, will go into one

cart. Residents will be able to receive up to three green waste carts and three recycling carts at no additional cost.

Starting July 1, the monthly fee for most residents will increase about a \$1 a month. The monthly fee will decrease about \$.85 a month for residents who select the 35-gallon trash cart. Carlsbad has historically had among the lowest trash rates in the county and will continue to even after the increase goes into effect July 1.

Supporting strong *neighborhoods*

The City of Carlsbad is offering a new service to help neighbors resolve disputes using trained volunteer mediators who are members of the Carlsbad community.

“Often if you can get into the same room with a neutral third party to help talk through the issues, grievances can be resolved,” said Sue Irey, the city’s volunteer coordinator. “Mediation is free, quick, confidential and will take place in Carlsbad. The goal of the program is to help residents address issues in a positive setting, rather than letting situations escalate.”

Issues commonly resolved through mediation involve property maintenance disputes, animal nuisance complaints, noise and neighbor-to-neighbor conflicts. The city’s program will not be used for disputes between landlords and tenants, nor between property owners and HOAs.

City volunteers have undergone intensive training and received certification through the National Conflict Resolution Center.

“A lot of the time, communication is the key issue. Once residents start improving communication and understanding, the entire neighborhood benefits,” said Irey. “We see this new program as an important tool to help keep Carlsbad neighborhoods strong.”

Creeks, lagoons and beaches *need spring cleaning too!*

When you're doing your annual spring cleaning, don't forget about the environment. During last year's Coastal Cleanup Day more than 1,000 pounds of trash were removed from Carlsbad beaches. Plastics, Styrofoam and cigarette butts are the most common items found. Do your part to keep trash out of our waterways.

- Make sure your trash is bagged and tied.
- Cover dumpsters and trash cans.
- Properly store or dispose of any household hazardous materials such as paint, solvents and cleaning supplies.
- Properly dispose of cigarette butts.
- Participate in a cleanup event, such as the Creek to Bay Cleanup or California Coastal Cleanup Day.

Deliveries will be made between June 4 and June 29
on residents' regular service day.

Cart Delivery

The delivery of new carts will begin June 4 and be completed by June 29. Deliveries will occur on residents' regular service day during the four week period. Delivery schedules will be posted on Waste Management's website beginning May 28.

Cart Exchanges

If your initial cart selection does not meet your service needs and a change is necessary, you will be allowed to exchange each type of cart once during the first 90 days following the initial delivery date. After 90 days, one additional exchange can be made at no charge. Any exchanges after that will result in a \$10 delivery charge.

Recycle Unwanted Cans & Crates

The week following delivery of your new carts, Waste Management will come through and collect all empty, unwanted cans and recycling crates. Special "Take Me" stickers will be supplied to every resident in a Cart Information Package, which will be attached to the new carts the day of delivery. Place these stickers only on the unwanted cans. Recycling crates will automatically be removed.

Residents can also drop off their unwanted cans and crates at Waste Management's facility located at 5960 El Camino Real from June 11 through July 13.
