

The City of Carlsbad is offering free, curbside pickup and drop-off bin locations for Christmas trees from Friday, Dec. 26, to Saturday, Jan. 10. The trees will be recycled and converted into mulch that will be used throughout San Diego County.

Residents are encouraged to cut down trees so they fit inside the green waste cart, with the lid closed, for collection. However, trees will be collected if cut in half, bundled and placed next to the green waste cart.

The tree stand, lights and all other decorations must be removed from the tree prior to recycling. Flocked trees are not recyclable and must be disposed of through regular trash service. Flocked trees must fit into the trash cart, with the lid closed, for disposal.

## Reduce Irrigation Times This Winter

he Carlsbad Municipal Water District has declared a "drought alert," which includes mandatory limits on outdoor irrigation to conserve water. Starting this fall and continuing until spring, residents may water three days a week, but only for five minutes per station.





The best way to save water is to focus on reducing outdoor use. Plant drought tolerant landscaping, don't over water, fix leaks and misaligned irrigation systems, and sweep instead of hosing off paved surfaces. Eliminating run off has the added benefit of preventing pollutants from getting carried through gutters and storm drains to our lagoons and oceans.
