### What's going on with the **power plant**?

You may have noticed the new power plant being built just west of I-5 on the site of the 65-year-old Encina Power Station. According to NRG, the company building the new plant, construction is progressing on schedule, and the new plant is scheduled to start operations by the end of 2018. NRG also owns and operates the Encina power plant,

According to NRG, **the new power plant** should be operational by the **end of 2018** and the existing Encina Power Station demolished in 2020-2021.

which it plans to decommission in 2019 after the new plant is operational and demolish in 2020 to 2021, as part of an agreement with the City of Carlsbad. That agreement also calls for NRG to work with the city and the community to develop a plan for the future use of the old power plant site. Under the city's recently updated General Plan, the power plant property has been designated for a combination of commercial uses and open space.




# Fun Things to Do
